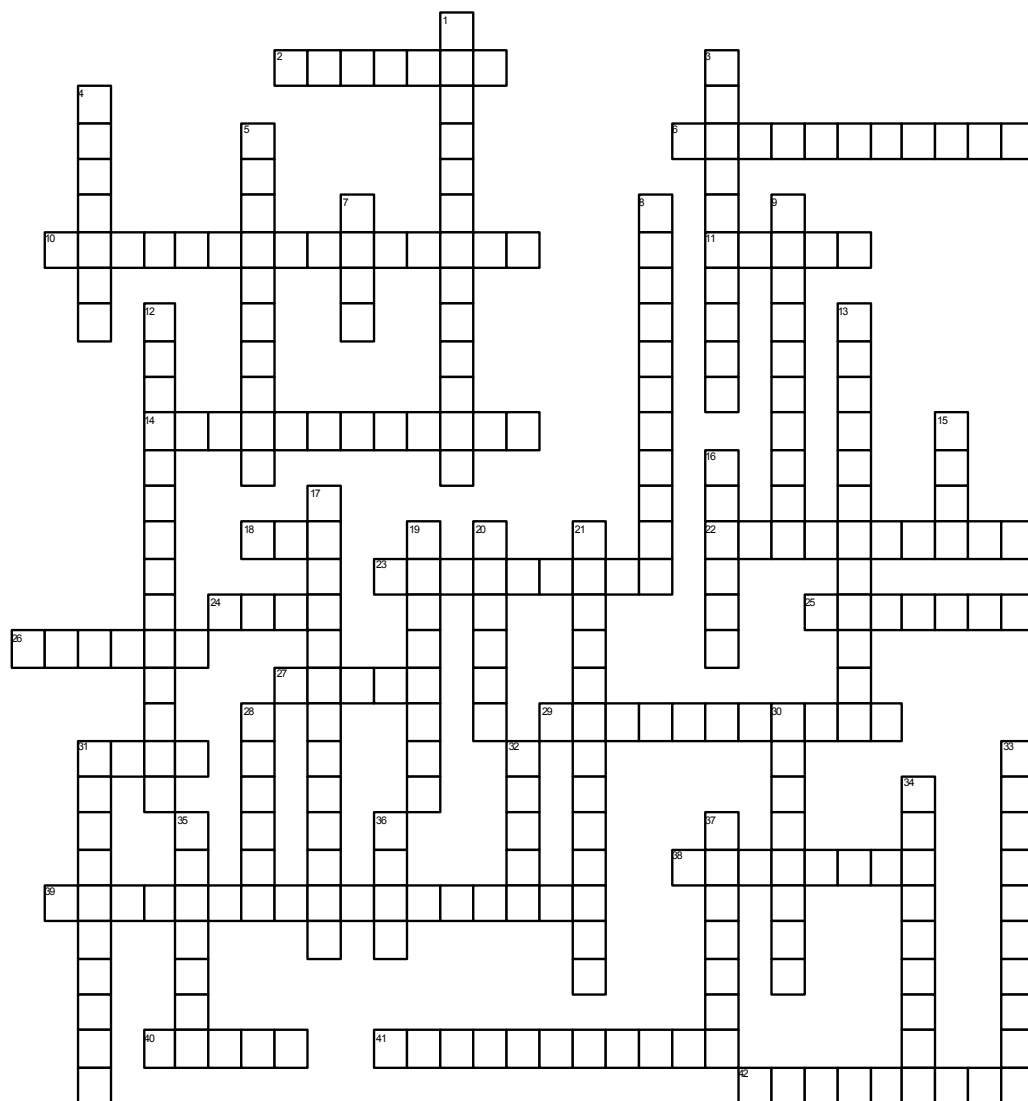


# Remembering Martin Luther King Jr.
