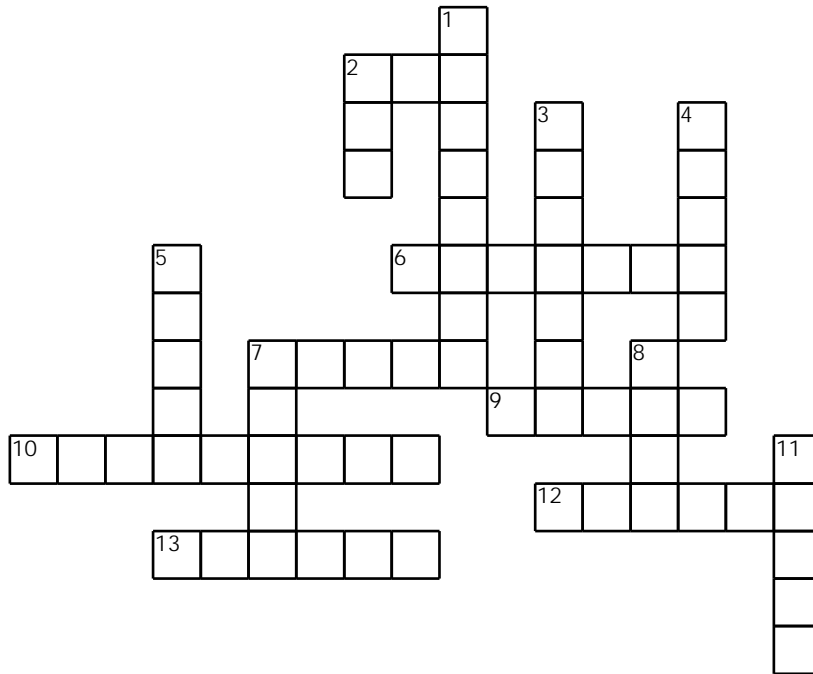


Grandparents Around the World
